AFFORDABLE HOUSING	50 affordable housing mortgages approved totaling over \$8 million in loans. \$10,000 to the High School Carpentry Apprenticeship Program at Mount Royal to help build houses for Habitat for Humanity.
COMMUNITY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT	100% of profits stay in communities where branches are located. \$42,986 to support community building in Saskatoon. Provided \$609,900 for business start-ups creating 22 new jobs. \$20,000 to Cosmo Industries. \$30,000 to Saskatoon Zoo Foundation. \$500 to the Riversdale Business Improvement District.
ARTS AND CULTURE	\$2,000 to St. Mary's School Osyak Dance Troup. \$5,000 to the John Arcand Fiddle Fest. Gold sponsor of National Aboriginal Day Cultural Celebration and Pow Wow. Provided support to the Pleasant Hill Pow Wow.
ENVIRONMENT	Designated Sustainability Champion. Recycling bins located in all branches. 25,000 volunteers signed up for the 2010 Meewasin/Affinity Clean-Up Campaign. Use of videoconferencing, bicycle couriers to reduce carbon emissions.
HEALTHY COMMUNITIES	\$12,000 to Canadian Cancer Society. \$10,000 to St. Paul's Hospital Foundation. \$9,999 to SARBI to rehabilitate the Brain Injured. 55 staff participated in the Bridge City Boogie raising \$7,500 for Canwest Raise-a-Reader, the Saskatoon Crisis Nursery and the Boys and Girls Club of Saskatchewan.
YOUTH AND EDUCATION	\$7,000 in scholarships to local graduates.
EMPLOYEES	100% of staff given time off to volunteer. 2,840 volunteer hours completed by staff during business hours. \$68,870 is the economic value of staff volunteer hours. \$77,556 to the United Way raised from employee payroll deductions, matched at \$1.05 by the credit union.
